Stephen Spielberg's "On The Lot" will showcase amateur short movies, like *In Memory*, and will give one lucky winner a chance to have their vision realized on the big screen.

"It's a lot like American Idol, but with movies- and a lot less Ryan Seacrest," said Jackson of "On The Lot". He is hoping that the little things will make his movie stand out above the rest. "Our music is completely original. Carl Russell scored and recorded the entire soundtrack. It's really incredible."

But Greg did have a little help from his friends. James Winters, Sarah Bish, and Adam Tucker star in the short film. Eric Stolze and Jameson O'Guinn added some special behind the scenes work. In fact, everyone involved in the opus are Alton High alumni. "I think it's a testament to the kind of education we received at Alton High," said the movie's producer, Jameson O'Guinn. "We were all taught to be creative and do our best."
